Mr Clements has been unrelenting in his drive to ensure <u>all students</u> receive such a valuable experience of the world of work.

Finally, as I write, we wish the students on our Berlin and ski trips who departed this morning 'Godspeed' and thank the many staff willing to give of their time to make such incredible opportunities happen. We look forward to hearing all about your travels in Term 5.
